Applicants are invited to apply for the posts of **Head of JITs or Genocide Network Secretariat**

*EUROJUST is a European Union body established in 2002 (Council Decision 2002/187/JHA of 28 February 2002 on the setting up of EUROJUST, amended by Council Decision 2003/659/JHA of 18 June 2003 and by Council Decision 2009/426/JHA of 16 December 2008 on the strengthening of Eurojust) to enhance the effectiveness of the competent authorities within Member States dealing with serious cross-border and organised crime.*

*The College of EUROJUST is composed of 27 National Members, one nominated by each EU Member State. The College elects one of the National Members to be its President. The Administrative Director is responsible, under the supervision of the President, for the day-to-day administration of Eurojust and staff management.*

#### **About the Genocide Network Secretariat:**

The Genocide Network Secretariat of contact points was set up by Council Decision 2002/494/JHA and reaffirmed by Council Decision 2003/335/JHA to ensure a close cooperation between the national authorities in investigating and prosecuting the crime of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes.

The aim of the Network is to facilitate cooperation and assistance between the Member States' investigation and prosecution authorities and to exchange information on criminal investigation and prosecution of persons suspected of having committed or participated in the commission of the relevant crimes. For this purpose, each Member State has designated a Contact Point to facilitate cooperation and exchange of information between the national authorities of the Member States. At the same time, the Contact Points also form the Network and provide it with its active and flexible structure. The coordinated and continued work of the Network is supported by a Secretariat hosted by Eurojust.

## About the **JITs Network Secretariat**

The possibility of setting up Joint Investigation Teams is provided for in Article 13 of the 2000 MLA Convention. The Network of National Experts on Joint Investigation Teams (hereinafter JITs Network) was established in July 2005 and consists of at least one expert per Member State.

The goal of the JITs Network is to facilitate the work of practitioners in the Member States. The JITs Network primarily encourages the use of JITs – a specific form of cross-border legal assistance that enables direct exchange of information in the Team, without the need to utilise the traditional channel of mutual legal assistance. Moreover, the JITs Network facilitates the setting up of teams, helps in the sharing of experiences and best practices and assists practitioners in the various Member States with legislative, administrative and operational aspects relating to the establishment of JITs.

The **Head of the JITs** or **Genocide Network Secretariat** will provide overall direction, leadership and management to the assigned Secretariat as a separate Unit within Eurojust as set out in the Eurojust Decision, reporting directly to the **Administrative Director**.

### **1. Key accountabilities**

The successful applicant will be responsible for:

- Setting up and managing the internal organisation of the assigned Secretariat as a separate unit within the administration of Eurojust;
- Proactively disseminating relevant legal and practical information to the contact points of the assigned Secretariat and supporting the interaction and exchange of information amongst contact points, acting as focal contact point and facilitator of cooperation between Eurojust and the Secretariat's Network;
- Networking and liaising with the EU Trio Presidency and other Secretariat bodies and representatives (contact points, national correspondents, Trio Presidencies and other organisations);
- Managing the cooperation of the Secretariat with Eurojust as well as other organisations and bodies at national, European and international level;
- Organising conferences, seminars or other projects related to the activities of the assigned Secretariat and ensuring reporting within deadlines for all relevant stakeholders;
- Proactively building relations with EU and non-EU organisations and acting as an ambassador for Eurojust with external stakeholders;
- Providing highly specialised advice on complex issues to Eurojust management and the College (in the field of expertise);
- Developing and implementing internal policies, systems, procedures and guidelines and maintaining awareness of trends and developments (in the field of expertise);
- Developing and implementing strategic goals and objectives of the assigned Secretariat and giving directions to achieve its mission;

- Managing staff when assigned, including during the annual performance cycle;
- Planning and controlling all financial, human and other resources of the assigned Secretariat;
- Carrying out any other duties required in the interest of the organisation.

## **2. Qualifications and experience required**

### **a- Eligibility criteria**

Candidates will be considered for the selection phase on the basis of the following criteria to be fulfilled by the closing date for applications:

- A level of education that corresponds to completed university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma and, after having obtained the university diploma, at least **10 years** of appropriate professional experience,

**OR**

- A level of education that corresponds to completed university studies of at least 4 years attested by a diploma and after having obtained the university diploma, at least **9 years** of appropriate professional experience;
- Thorough knowledge of one of the languages of the Communities and a satisfactory knowledge of another language of the Communities to the extent necessary for the performance of his/her duties.

Furthermore, in order to be eligible, a candidate must:

- Be a national of one of the Member States of the Communities;
- Enjoy his/her full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed on him/her by the laws on military service;
- Meet the character requirements for the duties involved;
- Be physically fit to perform his/her duties.

### **b- Selection criteria**

Candidates selected on the basis of the above eligibility criteria will then be evaluated according to the following selection criteria:

## **Essential**

- Professional experience and knowledge in the areas mentioned above under “key accountabilities”;
- Degree in law, preferably with specialisation in the field of international criminal law and/or international humanitarian law and/or comparative criminal law and procedure and/or European law;
- At least three years of relevant work experience;
- Experience in the area of administration and management (please give concrete examples);
- Knowledge of the activities of the JITs or Genocide Network of contact points;
- Familiarity with the EU legal framework and practices and with EU law;
- Experience in legal research and analysis and in drafting reports;
- Ability to prioritise and organise workload to deliver high-quality results within deadlines;
- Excellent analytical and strategic thinking skills;
- Excellent oral and written communication skills;
- Excellent command of both written and spoken English, as this is the vehicular language of Eurojust;
- Excellent planning and organising skills;
- Excellent interpersonal skills to effectively and diplomatically interact with staff and third parties at all levels;
- Computer literacy;
- Discretion and ability to maintain confidentiality; and
- High degree of resilience and self-motivation.

## **Advantageous**

The following characteristics are considered as additional assets:

- Professional experience and/or knowledge of the law enforcement/judicial environment;
- Experience in Joint Investigation Teams **OR** experience as a contact point in respect of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes;
- Experience in working in a multicultural/EU environment; and
- Knowledge of additional EU languages.

**Applicants are requested, when sending their application, to provide a clear indication of the post for which they wish to apply (JITs or Genocide Secretariat). This information should be provided under “Motivation” in point 9 of the application form.**

## **3. Selection phase**

A Selection Board is nominated by the Appointing Authority. The Human Resources Unit assists the Selection Board by checking the fulfilment of all formal requirements and eligibility criteria. The responsibility for any decision made during this exercise

lies with the Selection Board. Failure to comply with one of the formal requirements or eligibility criteria will result in a disqualification of the applicant concerned.

The Selection Board then makes the decision on who is to be considered an eligible applicant for the selection process, in accordance with the requirements outlined in the vacancy notice, and decides from among the eligible applicants those who are to be invited to attend an interview. Candidates invited for an interview may be asked to undergo a written test. Shortlisted candidates may be required to undergo an assessment through an external centre.

The selection phase consists of an interview with the Selection Board, in order to evaluate the capacities of the candidates to perform the key accountabilities mentioned above. During the interview, special attention will be paid to the specific knowledge required for the post and the suitability and capacity of the candidate to adapt to a multicultural environment. The work of the Selection Board ends with the drawing up of a list of applicants suitable and a list of applicants unsuitable to occupy the position advertised.

### **Reserve list**

The list of suitable applicants is submitted to the Appointing Authority, who decides on the appointment of the successful candidate and the establishment of a reserve list for the post advertised. Candidates should note that inclusion on the reserve list does not guarantee recruitment.

Recruitment will be based on availability of posts and budget.

The reserve list may be used by other units or services in order to fulfil the same or similar positions within Eurojust.

The reserve list for this post will be valid until **31 December 2012** and may be extended at the discretion of the Appointing Authority of Eurojust.

## **4. Contractual conditions**

The Appointing Authority will appoint the successful candidate as a member of the temporary staff pursuant to Article 2(a) of the Conditions of employment of other servants of the European Communities, to which he/she will be subject, for a period of **5 years**. The contract may be renewed.

Remuneration will be based on the Community scale of salaries. Pay is subject to Community tax and other deductions laid down in the Staff Regulations. Remuneration is, however, exempt from any national taxation.

The grade for this position is **AD8**. The basic monthly salary of a temporary agent in the first step at **AD8** level, before any deductions or allowances, is approximately EUR 6,299.

The place of employment will be The Hague, where Eurojust has its official seat.

Prior to contract signature, the successful candidate will be requested:

- to provide Eurojust with original or certified copies of all relevant documents proving the candidate's eligibility criteria, including an extract from the candidates police file; and
- to undergo a compulsory medical examination to establish that the candidate meets the standard of physical fitness necessary to perform the duties involved.

### **Confirmation of appointment**

Temporary staff are required to serve a probationary period of **six** months.

### **Essential requirement for the selected applicants: Security Clearance**

Eurojust requires selected applicants to sensitive posts to undergo a security screening procedure and obtain a positive national opinion. The level of the latter depends on the specific classified data that post-holders deal with. For this post, the required level of clearance is SECRET.

Applicants who currently hold a valid and positive national security screening opinion at the above-mentioned level do not need to obtain a new one. They shall then provide a copy of such opinion to Eurojust and specify the issuing authority, level and date of expiry. In case the temporal validity of the opinion expires within a year, the renewal procedure shall be initiated expeditiously.

In case selected applicants do not currently hold a valid and positive national security screening opinion at the above-mentioned level, Eurojust will require them to sign a pre-screening self-declaration. Eurojust will request such opinion from the National Security Agency of the applicants' state of nationality.

In case such agency issues a negative opinion at the above-mentioned level after the signature of the contract of employment, Eurojust has the right to terminate the latter.

### **Declaration of commitment to serve public interest independently**

The successful candidate will be required to make a declaration of commitment to act independently in the public interest and to make a declaration in relation to interests that might be considered prejudicial to his/her independence.

The successful candidate will be required to carry out his/her duties and conduct him/herself solely with the interests of the Communities in mind; he/she shall neither seek nor take instruction from any government, authority, organisation or person outside his/her institution. He/she shall carry out the duties assigned with objectivity, impartiality and loyalty to the Communities.

### **Equal opportunity**

EUROJUST applies a policy of equal opportunity for men and women and accepts applications without distinction on grounds of sex, race, colour, ethnic or social origin, genetic characteristics, and language, religious, political or other convictions or opinions, financial situation, disability, age, sexual orientation, marital status or family situation.

### **5. Submission of applications**

Please indicate the **reference number on the application form, in the heading of your e-mail and in all future correspondence relating to this application.**

Candidates must use the E-application form available on the website of Eurojust and must mention the reference number and the title of the post for which they are applying. All the questions on the form must be answered in full. The application form must be completed in English. Eurojust publishes multiple posts at the same time and if the candidate wishes to apply for more than one post, he/she must submit a separate application form for each post.

Should applicants be invited for an interview, in order for the application to be considered complete, they **must bring with them on the day of the interview originals or certified photocopies of all the supporting documents for their educational qualifications and employment (diplomas, certificates, statements of employment, professional references, etc.) and photocopies of these documents necessary to prove that they fulfil the eligibility criteria.** All documentary evidence of professional experience must indicate both start and end dates of previous positions and the start date of the position held currently.

**Eurojust has the right to disqualify applicants who fail to submit all the required documents on the date of the interview.**

Please note that any documents submitted will not be returned to the candidates.

Application forms sent by fax or by post **will not** be accepted, except for candidates who have a **proven** disability that prevents them from applying via e-mail. These candidates may submit by post, no later than the indicated closing date for the submission of applications (the postmark date will serve as proof), a printed version of the application form, and mail it indicating the reference number of the selection procedure and title of the post to: EUROJUST, Recruitment Office, P.O. **Closing Date:** Closing dates for the submission of applications are strictly adhered to. In the heading of the e-mail, the reference number of the post and the title of the post for which a candidate is applying must be mentioned.

To summarise:

The **application form** must be fully completed in English. Applications must be sent to [applications@eurojust.europa.eu](mailto:applications@eurojust.europa.eu) no later than the indicated closing date, mentioning the reference number and the vacancy and title of the position in the header of the e-mail.

The Human Resources Unit will acknowledge receipt of applications. Due to the volume of applications, only candidates selected for the interviews will be contacted further. Candidates are invited to follow the recruitment process status on the Eurojust website.

***Please note that the Selection Board's work and deliberations are strictly confidential and that any contact, direct or indirect, with its members is strictly forbidden.***

All personal data collected for any selection procedure to be handled by Eurojust will only be used for its purposes and will in no case be transmitted to any third party.
