DATA PROTECTION NOTICE For managing the list of subscribers to the quarterly newsletter of Eurojust

1. Context and controller

The Corporate Communications Unit (CCU) needs to process the contact details of all subscribers to the <u>Eurojust quarterly newsletter</u> to inform the European citizens of the activities of Eurojust. CCU distributes this newsletter four times a year, via email.

The processing of personal data of is subject to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC.

Collecting and processing personal data within CCU are under the responsibility of the Controller, who is the Head of CCU, and can be reached at the e-mail address dp comms@eurojust.europa.eu.

2. What personal information do we collect, for what purpose, on which legal basis and through which technical means?

Types of personal data

The public communications team within CCU collects the e-mail address of subscribers¹. The sign-up for the newsletter can be done:

- 1. by e-mail, Eurojust keeps a copy of that e-mail as proof of consent;
- 2. by the contact form on the Eurojust website, where the subscribers are informed that they give explicit consent to be on the list.

Eurojust <u>only processes the data that you provide in the subscription form.</u> A possibility to unsubscribe from the contact list is provided in all the Eurojust newsletter issues.

Purpose of the processing

The objective of the subscriber list is to enable the distribution of the quarterly newsletter.

Legal basis

The personal data will be only processed and stored on the basis of your consent in accordance with Article 5 (1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725. Please note that you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. To do that, please contact the Corporate Communications Unit via the following e-mail address: SubscribeEurojustNews@eurojust.europa.eu, and we will do what is technically and organisationally possible to accomplish your request as soon as possible.

Technical means

Your data are stored on our secure IT network, and access is only provided on a need-to-know

basis. No paper copies are kept or shared with other institutions or private companies.

3. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

For the purposes detailed above in section 2, access to your personal data is only possible for duly authorised staff members working in the Corporate Communications Unit.

Only members of the wider public communications team, the Administrative Assistant to CCU and the Head of CCU (as well as those who will replace them during periods of extended absence) can access the data. Eurojust do not share your information with any third party.

4. How do we protect and safeguard your information?

To protect your personal data, a number of technical and organisational security measures to ensure confidentiality have been put in place by Eurojust, based on a Risk Assessment.

Concerning unauthorised access to equipment and data, Eurojust's secure premises are protected by Eurojust-specific physical security measures. Administrative measures include the obligation for all authorised personnel having access to personal data stored on Eurojust servers to be security screened or sign a confidentiality agreement, and for service providers maintaining the equipment and systems to be individually security cleared and to have signed non-disclosure and confidentiality agreements.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The email addresses on the list will be kept as long as the newsletter is issued. Specific emails will be removed upon receiving an automated message stating that the email address is not functioning any longer, or if the person asks to have his or her data removed from or changed in the database.

6. How can you verify, modify or delete your information?

You have the right to access, rectify or erase or restrict the processing of your personal data or, where applicable, the right to object to processing or the right to data portability in line with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725. Any such request should be directed to the Controller at the following e-mail address: dp comms@eurojust.europa.eu.

A reminder of the possibility to unsubscribe from the database is included every time a newsletter is both sent out and placed on the website. The Eurojust website informs subscribers how to unsubscribe.
